To Whom It May Concern:

The New Hampshire Office of Energy and Planning (OEP) estimates that as of December 31, 2011, the total number of housing units in the Town of Troy was 842. Of those units, OEP estimates that 517 were single-family, detached dwellings; 233 were multi-family units; and 92 were manufactured housing units. OEP arrived at this figure by using the estimated figures reported by the U.S. Census Bureau American Community Survey for 2007 through 2011, which was adjusted based on reports of building permits issued and demolitions recorded by the Town of Troy. (The margin of error reported for the American Community Survey total figure was +/-93 units.)
